Chesapeake Care Clinic is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with a rich history of compassion and commitment. Established in 1992, we have been providing medical and dental care for the underserved for over 29 years.

We recognize medical and dental care are basic needs that are not affordable and accessible to everyone. Even with Medicaid expansion and the Affordable Care Act, there is still a massive gap in healthcare coverage. In Virginia, many people are asset limited, income constrained, and employed but cannot afford health insurance.

Chesapeake Care Clinic strives to bridge the gap in healthcare by providing comprehensive health care to low-income and underserved in our community.

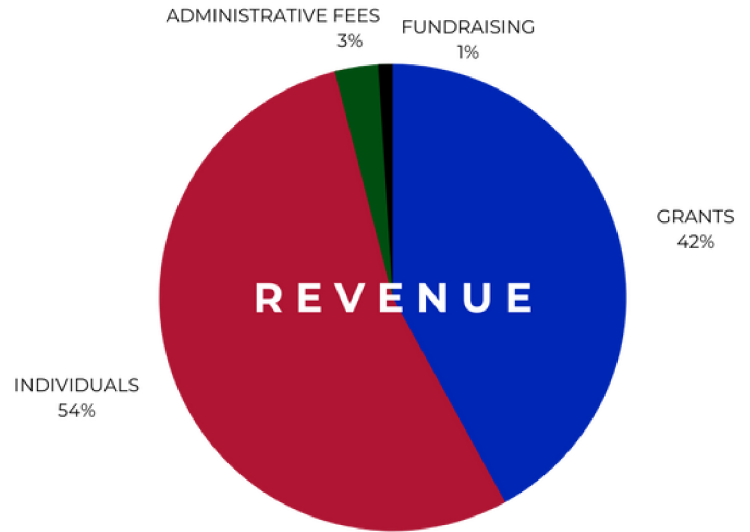
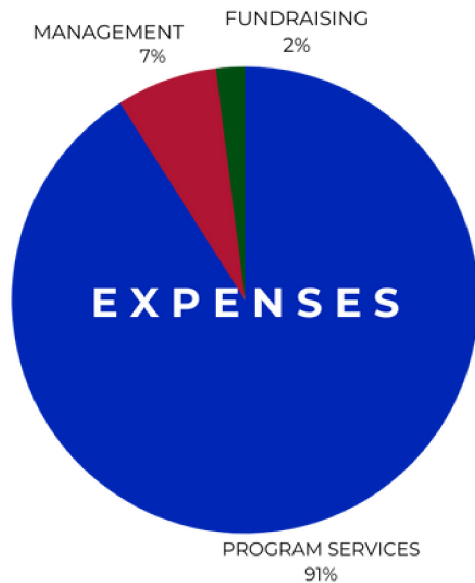

Mail Delivery Program
Medications are mailed to patients' homes reducing transportation barriers and reducing exposure to COVID-19



Home Monitoring Devices
Devices, including blood pressure cuffs, glucometers, and COVID-19 tests are provided to patients to test safely in their homes

MISSION OF MERCY

We hosted our 1st Mission of Mercy event on March 24-26, 2022. Partnering with Virginia Dental Association Foundation (VDAF) and Virginia Commonwealth University School of Dentistry, we provided free dental extractions to 71 patients. Over the three day event, 71 Hampton Roads patients received a total of 217 free dental extractions, exams and oral cancer screenings.
